## Overview

The second edition of the Zanzibar- EU Business Forum, hosted by the Zanzibar Investment Promotion Authority (ZIPA) in collaboration with the European Union and the European Business Group (EUBG) was successfully held in Zanzibar, Golden Tulip Airport Hotel, drawing over 250 participants. Officially officiated by the **President of Zanzibar and Chairman of the Revolutionary Council Dr. Hussein Ali Mwinyi,** the event also welcomed distinguished government officials, a delegation from the European Union, European and Zanzibari business community. Building on the momentum from the inaugural forum in 2022, this year's gathering focused on strengthening business partnerships and exploring investment opportunities in Zanzibar, a vital hub in the Indian Ocean.

## Theme:

This year's theme, "Strengthening Zanzibar – European Union Partnership: A Public-Private Dialogue," underscored the importance of collaboration among policymakers, investors, and business leaders. The forum aimed to enhance the business climate and pinpoint key growth sectors, ensuring actionable dialogues and productive outcomes.



## **Focus Areas**

Throughout the event, discussions centered on pivotal areas expected to drive sustainable growth in Zanzibar:

- · Sustainable Tourism: Strategies for responsible and resilient tourism were debated to ensure that Zanzibar remains a choice destination while preserving its unique heritage.
- · ICT & Digitalization: Addressing opportunities to unlock Zanzibar's digital economy potential, fostering innovation, and improving connectivity.
- Fisheries & Aquaculture: Exploring methods to add value to fishing activities and bolster innovation in the sector.
- Maritime Logistics: Discussions aimed at strengthening port operations to enhance trade efficiency.
- Circular Economy: Best practices for advancing sustainability through waste reduction and recycling initiatives.
- · Renewable Energy: Strategies to expand clean energy solutions were evaluated, focusing on long-term development benefits.
- · Business Environment & Taxation: Enhancements to policies were discussed to better facilitate investment and foster a conducive business climate.

- · Enabling networking opportunities through "business to business" and "business to government" engagements.



# **Calls to Action**

The following are calls to action adopted by the Zanzibar – EU Business Forum 2025:

SUSTAINABLE TOURISM: How to facilitate sustainable tourism and safeguard Zanzibar's resources for economic growth.

- Establish a comprehensive roadmap for implementing the Sustainable Tourism Declaration, incorporating green certification and <sup>1</sup>. GSTC-aligned action items for each stakeholder group;
  - Craft a Zanzibar Sustainable Tourism Best Practices Guidebook to serve as a practical resource for industry-wide adoption (in operation
- 2. and investment); Design a collaborative public-private sector framework outlining priority areas (such as waste management, community engagement,
- 3. and renewable energy) to accelerate the Sustainable Tourism Declaration's implementation, complete with defined roles, timelines, and resource allocation strategies;

Launch an interactive digital hub under the 'Zanzibar Sustainable Tourism Declaration' banner to facilitate knowledge sharing, 4. resource distribution, and progress tracking among all stakeholders;

### ICT and DIGITALIZATION How can digitalization foster economic growth in Zanzibar and what needs to change.

- 5. That the Public Sector and the Private Sector will continue to promote the use and application of ICT to foster the digital economy and improve public service delivery;
- The government will continue to foster the use of technology to reduce any possible bureaucracy and improve ease of doing business; 6.
- 7. The government will continue to build digital public infrastructure and build human capital to enhance systems communicate with each other, build inclusive economy and a shore a more active participation of the private sector;

### FISHERIES AND AQUACULTURE: How to foster innovative new methods to add value to the sector and address stumbling blocks.

- 8. The Government through the Ministry of Blue Economy will continue to empower fishers and seaweed growers to access latest available technologies to reduce adapt to climate change and ensure production for the value chain;
- 9. That the government through the Ministry of Blue Economy will continue to allocate funding to empower the fishermen so that they are able to improve catch handling to reduce postharvest losses and increase the quality and value of catch;
- 10. That the government will through the Ministry of Blue Economy increase data transparency for the sustainable development of Zanzibar's fisheries with the assistance of Fisheries Transparency Initiative (FITI);
- 11. That the government through the Ministry of Blue Economy will continue to promote the involvement of youth and women in the development of aquaculture including seaweed farming to ensure ongoing recruitment into production;

- 12. That the government will continue to oversee the port's performance and ensure its efficiency and security; security is a responsibility of both the public as private sector
- 13. That the public sector and the private sector will further strengthen the cooperation to ensure that port management and handlers are capacitated accordingly to be able to improve their performance;
- 14. That the maritime logistic systems are further digitalized to increase efficiency and reduce wastage of time and other resources;

WASTE MANAGEMENT AND CIRCULAR ECONOMY: How to accelerate sustainable resource and waste management: "reduce, reuse, recycle". What needs to change

- 15. That the government and the private sector will continue to ensure that the public is informed of the negative impact of mishandling of waste:
- 16. That the Government will encourage the private sector to invest in the recycling plants which also in turn will reduce waste but also create employment;
- 17. That we have strong policies and enforcement mechanisms promoting proper waste management practices are crucial;
- 18. That the government should ensure that knowledge on waste management and circular economy is dispensed as early as lower grades - nursery and primary levels to ensure as the generations grow it becomes part of good and positive behaviour;

- 19. That the public sector and the private sector will continue to champion dissemination of information and knowledge towards the use of clean energy for various purposes;
- 20. Identification of investment opportunities in renewable energy, that the private sector is attracted swiftly to invest in alternative energy options;
- 21. That both the public sector and private sector promote innovations that will eventually replace old technology with more innovative solutions for sustainable and quality energy supply and economic growth;
- 22. That gaps are identified in the regulatory framework and recommendations for reforms to facilitate renewable energy deployment;

TAX REGIME IN TANZANIA Do existing legal frameworks challenge trade between Mainland and Zanzibar and what needs to change?

- 23. That we increase more effort in information technology and awareness to all stakeholders so as to ensure full compliance;
- 24. That we increase administrative support to the authorities in both regions to enable them to implement a more integrated tax system much sooner to avoid double assessments and taxation;
- 25. That the private and public sector continue to promote investment opportunities so as to improve revenue collection which as a result will accommodate a bigger budget to build the capacity on the administration of the tax authorities
